Village School PARCC

Performance Based Assessment Schedule



<u> March 2 – March 27, 2015</u>

Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC) gives schools a twenty day testing window in which to administer five days of assessments to each third and fourth grade classroom in March. Three days are for Language Arts and two are for Mathematics. Village School chose to schedule each class for one full week of PARCC testing for several reasons.

First, this replicates the testing schedule that we have successfully used for over a decade with the NJ ASK. Our fourth graders experienced it last year, with students testing for four consecutive days, beginning in the morning. This is exactly what our PARCC testing schedule will look like. We don't believe that compressing it into fewer days or spreading it out over several weeks would be helpful.

Unlike the NJ ASK, which was a pencil and paper assessment, the PARCC is computer-based, and we currently have the ability to test one third of the entire student body simultaneously. As a result, we leveraged our available Chromebooks to create three, one week sessions with nine or ten classes testing for a full week. Makeup testing will take place during the fourth week of the PARCC testing window.

Classes not taking the PARCC assessments on a particular week will be able to have a full academic schedule with full length related arts classes, something that wasn't possible with NJ ASK testing. Related arts classes may take place at a different time, and a few classes may have lunch at a slightly later time.

Our teachers have been preparing Village School students for the PARCC assessments all year through their everyday, Common Core based instruction. This includes writing and math experiences using Chromebooks and practice with the PARCC test format. Students will also try out the accessibility features during Technology class. As we previously informed you, all VES students now have Ready Test A-Z as an add-on to their Raz Kids account. Parents can work at home with their children on this PARCC-like tutorial, and students will be using it here in school.

Taken together, we believe that these tools and strategies, along with the aforementioned schedule will enable our students to begin their PARCC testing lives in a positive, lowest possible-stress environment and build confidence for their future testing experiences.

Finally, we want to remind you that all students will need to provide earbuds or inexpensive headphones for use with PARCC. We know most of your children already have them, but we wanted to remind you about this ahead of testing. Thank you for your ongoing support!
