## **BYOD Permission Form**

- 1. The student is responsible for the security and proper care of their personal device, including any costs of repair, replacement or any modifications needed to use the device at school. MTSD is not responsible for any damage or theft that may occur.
- 2. Violations of any Board policies, administrative procedures or school rules involving a student's personally owned device may result in the loss of use of the device in school and/or disciplinary action.
- 3. Technology may be used at the discretion of the teachers as their lessons warrant -the student must comply with teacher's' request to shutdown the computer or close the screen.
- 4. The student may not use the devices to record, transmit or post photos or video of a person or persons on campus. Nor can any images or video recorded at school be transmitted or posted at any time without the express permission of a teacher.
- 5. The student should only use their device for educational purposes.
- 6. Students can be held accountable for any inappropriate or illegal content accessed on their devices, while the device is being operated on school premises.
- 7. The student will use the district's secured and CIPA compliant wireless network. Use of 3G/4G/5G wireless connections are not allowed. No VPN connections are permitted within the school building.
- 8. The student should have full working knowledge of how to use their device. Teachers are not responsible for the training and use of student devices. *Teachers will support students in the utilization of necessary classroom applications.*

I understand and will abide by the above policy and guidelines. I further understand that any violation of the above may result in the loss of network and/or device privileges as well as other disciplinary action. The use of any technology which bypasses or compromises the district's network and its security measures in violation of this agreement. As a parent, I understand that my child will be responsible for abiding by the above policy and guidelines. I have read and discussed them with him/her/they and they understand the responsibility they have in the use of their personal computing device.
