Student Evaluation

Grading will be based on a total points system. Each assignment will be categorized appropriately into the following categories:

- Test/Quizzes/Essay
- Projects/Scored Discussion
- Homework/Classwork

Class rules:

- ★ **Come to each class prepared to learn and participate.** By the time the class starts, you must be in your seat and ready to learn.

Assignments

Homework (excluding essays and projects) is due by the date and time specified by the teacher. Students present in class without their assignment will be given **half credit** for the assignment if turned in the following class block AND if the assignment was not reviewed in class. However, it is suggested that such work still be completed, for it is likely that it will be covered in an assessment.

Essays and projects not submitted on or before the due date and time will be penalized 10 percent per day (NOT BLOCK) if the essay/project is not submitted.

Work missed due to absence must be handed in, at the beginning of class, within the same number of missed classes (i.e. if you are absent 2 blocks, all missed work must be submitted at the beginning of the second block upon return). This is YOUR responsibility!

All digital submissions are due on the assigned date/time (whether the student is present in class or not) unless there are extenuating circumstances as determined by the teacher.

Assessments

If you are absent on the day of an assessment, you will be expected to make arrangements to take the test when you return. Assessments must be made up either during an after-school session or during study hall as arranged between teacher and student and **within a week of the student returning to school**. An alternate assessment may be given to students who miss class on the day of a test.

**Assessments not arranged and taken within a week of your return will result in a zero unless there is an extenuating circumstance to be determined by the teacher and/or supervisor.

Social Studies Remediation Policy

If a student would like to remediate an assessment with a grade below 50%, they must make arrangements with the teacher within 48 hours of the grade being posted. Remediation can only bring the grade up to a 50%.

Students must remediate assessments within 2 weeks of the grade being posted or

before the next unit test is given, whichever comes first.

Social Studies Academic Integrity Guidelines

1. Submitted work is always written in my own words, even when I work with others to complete an assignment.
 - a. When using others' ideas or words, I may paraphrase/quote and cite them using MLA format for no more than 25% of my assignment (this percentage does not reflect Turnitin.com expectations). Not citing these sources will be considered **plagiarism**.
 - b. I take responsibility for the quality and integrity of my own work and for the quality and integrity of group work.
 - c. I will not copy others' work.
 - d. I will not copy any information from the Internet or print sources and submit it as my own, this includes information created by an AI site.
 - e. I will not share my work with others, regardless of the intent
2. I will not give help nor accept help from another student during a test or graded assignment unless express permission is given by the teacher.
 - a. I will not discuss assessment questions or prompts with other students who have not yet taken the assessment
