Guidance Offerings from Mrs. Fornal and Mrs. McCarthy

Hello! We are excited to begin the school year! This year, we welcome Heather McCarthy to the counseling staff. Mrs. McCarthy earned her Bachelor's degree in Psychology from Vassar College and a Master's degree in Counseling from The University of Pennsylvania. She then worked as a K-8 School Counselor in Philadelphia School District. As a former student, Mrs. McCarthy is thrilled to return to Montgomery Township Schools. This year, she will be providing services to students at Village and Orchard Hill Elementary Schools.

We are pleased to offer individual and small group counseling to students who would benefit from additional support. Parents and teachers may refer students when they feel a child needs a safe place to go to express their thoughts, feelings, and concerns. The first group of the year, the Newcomers Club, will be held during the first few weeks of school to assist new students with their transition into Montgomery Township Schools. The students will be given the opportunity to talk to other new students, ask questions about the school, and to participate in activities.

Other groups that will be offered throughout the year focus on helping students with Social Skills, Controlling Emotions, Self-Esteem, Separation/Divorce, Loss, How Your Engine Runs, Organization, Relaxation, and Siblings of Special Needs. These groups will begin in late September or early October. Parents are encouraged to contact us if they feel their children would benefit from any of these groups. As the year progresses, we will be providing monthly guidance lessons following the Steps to Respect Anti-Bullying Program and emphasizing the pillars of character. The pillars include: Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring, Citizenship, Sportsmanship, Friendship, Honesty, and Leadership. We will also work closely with teachers, administrators, and other faculty to monitor the academic, social, and emotional needs of students to determine the appropriate interventions that can help students reach their full potential. We look forward to a successful year and to working with many students and parents. The History of Blazer, Our Bluebird



Bluebirds were harbingers of spring until their numbers were drastically reduced through use of pesticides along with habitat destruction before the era of environmental awareness. Bluebirds thrive in areas of open farmlands where insects and old woodpecker holes exist. Montgomery offers this type of habitat, especially in the land around Village School, and can be enhanced with the addition of bluebird houses.

Cousins of the robin, Bluebirds have made a comeback through the efforts of people who provide and maintain nesting boxes along bluebird "trails." Several bluebird boxes were installed on VES grounds a few years ago. As a result, bluebirds have become commonplace around VES and in many parts of Montgomery. Students can learn about and observe these quiet, beautiful birds right here on our school grounds while practicing caring and responsibility for our fellow inhabitants.

In April 2006, Village Students voted to name our mascot Blazer the Bluebird and in 2007 they voted for our school motto: Blazer says, "Be Your Best at VES!"

IMPORTANT SCHOOL DAY PROCEDURES—*PLEASE REVIEW*

ARRIVAL, DISMISSAL, VISITING AND PARKING

- **School Hours:** The school day begins at 9:30 and ends at 3:50.
- **Transportation:** Buses will drop students off and pick them up at the main entrance to VES. Your child's transportation arrangements are available on *Genesis* accessible from the district home page. Delays during the first days of school are normal.
- **Before School Drop Off:** If you need to drive your child to school, you must travel on Spruce Drive and use the **rear** entrance of the school. **This entrance will be open from 9:20 a.m. - 9:30 a.m. Please do not drop your child off early as the doors will be locked until 9:20.** When dropping children off at the rear entrance in the morning, if you stop your vehicle **next** to the school sidewalk, your child may exit by his or her self on that side of your vehicle. However, if your child has to walk across lanes of traffic, you **must** walk him or her to the sidewalk. Please do not drop students off in the front of Village School at any time. After 9:30 a.m., park in our front visitors' lot and **an adult must sign children in at the main office.**
- **After School Pickup:** If you need to pick your child up at the end of the school day, park in the large back lot and enter through the cafeteria doors or park on the right side of the back driveway that is between the school and the traffic island and enter through the main rear entrance doors. **Please do not park on the roadway itself as it creates a traffic hazard.** Students will be dismissed to the cafeteria for parent pick-up at 3:45 p.m. as instruction takes place up until this time. **Parents must sign children out in the cafeteria.** Please send a note to your child's teacher in the morning if you plan on picking up your child in the afternoon or if your child is attending an after school activity. **Without a note, children will be sent to their buses.** Midday and end of day pickup requests can be disruptive to instruction and are difficult to honor as dismissal information is confirmed early in the day.
- **School Day Visits: All parents/visitors arriving between 9:30 and 3:45 must provide photo identification.** After you push the button to buzz in, you **must** give your name and scheduled appointment destination, enter through the front entrance, report to the main office, show identification, sign in and obtain a visitor nametag. During special events, the Spruce Drive/rear entrance hours may be extended. These times will be communicated in advance. Visitors must sign out in the office before leaving the premises.
- **Late or Midday Drop off/Pickup:** If you need to drop off or pickup your child between the hours of 9:30 and 3:45, please park in our visitors' parking lot in the front of VES and use the main front entrance. **Parking is not permitted in the front driveway as it is a bus driveway only.** **After 9:30 a.m., children must be signed in by an adult.** You must submit a request in writing in advance if a late arrival or early pick up is planned. (BOE Policy 5230) **Please sign your child in or out at the main office.**
- **School Day Parking:** Parents/visitors may park in our front visitors' lot, our side lot, or our large lot in the back between 9:30 and 3:45. When parking in the back lot, all visitors will need to walk around VES and enter the front main entrance. **Please do not park on or block roadways.** If you absolutely must park on a roadway, use caution and park on the far right side. **Parking is always prohibited in designated fire zones and in the bus driveway.** Please use caution when parking along the side of the road and driveways. **Always park off the road to the right as far as possible and do not block roadways.**
- **Traffic Flow:** From Main Blvd., turn onto Brophy Circle toward the rear of the school. Bear left, traveling **west** on Spruce Drive or **west** into the driveway. Please maintain a one way traffic flow (counterclockwise) around the school at all times. There are one way signs to serve as reminders. To exit, continue west on Spruce Drive, or left on Schley Road, both will lead you back to Main Blvd.



Facilities Updates and Reminders

This summer, we had several new air conditioning units installed in Village School. They will greatly improve the efficiency and comfort level of our building. New carpeting was installed in the 100 Wing and main office areas, and one third of our classrooms were painted. An important security enhancement was the installation of electronic key fob devices at several exterior doors, including the main entrance. They will enable us to keep all exterior doors locked during the school day while permitting only authorized staff to access the building. Along with the security cameras that were installed last spring, Village School has significantly upgraded our school security.

We want to express our appreciation to our school and district custodial staff for their work getting our schools clean and safe. The director of facilities, Mr. Bob Austin, custodial supervisor Mr. Bruce Fleming and custodians from other schools worked together with Mr. Ken Vaccaro, our VES head custodian, night supervisor Mrs. Debra Newbury, and VES custodians Dan Moore, Hugo Guerrero and Mike Colucci to get all of our schools ready for opening day. District policy and mandatory regulations can be located on our district web-site at www.mtsd.k12.nj.us. By following the link entitled "Board of Education" and by clicking on the left hand menu entitled "Board of Education Policies", you will be able to access all school policies. For those who do not have access to a computer, copies of the policies are available in the main office of the schools.

Student Attendance Information

Village School students exit buses at 9:20 AM, along with students whose parents choose to drop them off at the rear of the school. This arrival procedure takes about 10 minutes. If you bring your child to school after 9:30 a.m. you must sign him or her in at the office in person. Otherwise, your child may be marked absent. The following are key points of Attendance Policy/Regulation 5200, Tardiness Policy 5240 and Late Arrival and Early Dismissal Policy 5230.

- Students must be in school for 4 hours to be considered present for the day. A child who is in school for less than 4 hours will be marked absent.
- A student absence may be considered an excused absence for the following reasons: NJ State approved religious holidays (N.J.S.A. 18A:36-14), personal illness or medical appointment with health care provider written documentation, family illness or death, court appearance, quarantine or suspension.
- All other absences will be considered unexcused.
- When a student accumulates an excessive number of absences, the school will send a warning notice to his or her parents or guardians.
- All excused and unexcused absences are expected to be verified/communicated by the parent with the school.
- In accordance with Policy 5240 students are expected to be on time to avoid the negative educational consequences associated with tardiness. Tardiness will be excused for illness, emergency in the family, observance of a religious holiday, a death in the family or by administrative directive. A warning letter will be sent home when a student is tardy for an excessive number of days.
- In accordance with Policy 5230, an administrator may excuse the late arrival or early dismissal of a student due to a medical appointment, medical disability or court appearance upon the prior written request of a parent or guardian.

More Helpful Information

- * **Communicating With Teachers:** The best ways to communicate or set up an appointment with teachers are by sending an email, writing a note, or by leaving a voicemail message.
 - * **Reporting Absences:** Please call the school's main number (609) 466-7606 and press one to help us verify that your child will not be in on that day. Please state your child's name, teacher's name, the date and reason for the absence.
 - * **Lunch Information:** Students may bring lunch from home or purchase a school lunch. Detailed information about the purchasing procedures are attached.
 - * **Snacks:** You may pack a healthy snack and water for your child. Water helps us maintain a clean classroom environment. Snacks may be eaten in the morning for those with a late lunch and in the afternoon for those with an early lunch.
 - * **Backpacks:** While rolling backpacks are popular and convenient items for today's students, please note that these particular backpacks can pose a tripping hazard in our busy hallways and do not fit into students' individual classroom cubbies designed to hold his/her personal belongings during the school day.
 - * **Games/Electronic Devices/Cell Phones:** Due to the risk of loss, damage, and disruption to the learning environment, the use of these items during the school day is strongly discouraged. Students are encouraged to engage in social interactions with their peers during lunch, recess, and on the bus ride to and from school. If games and electronics are brought to school, students will be required to keep them off and in backpacks during instructional time. Cell phones may not be used during school hours.
 - * **Roller Sneakers:** For safety reasons, students are not permitted to wear roller sneakers to school with the wheels installed.

Dear Village School Parents and Guardians

Welcome back! I hope everyone had a great summer. I invite you to review September's lunch menu online at www.mtsd.k12.nj.us. Simply select Orchard Hill Elementary School from the main page and click on "Lunch Menu" to access the menu each month. To help your child know what is for lunch each day, it would be helpful if you could go over the menu the night before. This will help prevent unnecessary tears when children find they don't care for the day's hot lunch selection.

Please ensure that your child has the necessary funds in his/her account. You can check on this daily/weekly by calling the kitchen in the morning to find out the remaining balance or go to our new online site www.payforit.net. At the point that your child has five lunches remaining, the cashier will give your child a friendly reminder. Mrs. Armstrong, my assistant Director, will contact you by phone or email in order to remind you to make a deposit to your child's account. Lunch deposit forms are available on the school website. Children are permitted to buy only two hot lunches on credit. If by chance the funds do not get replenished at this point we will offer a Peanut Butter and Jelly Lunch Bag, or Fun Bagel Lunch Bag until the account is replenished. Students with peanut allergies will be offered a bagel as health alerts are in the computerized system and appear on the screen during check out. You will still be charged for these lunches. Lunch at the elementary schools will cost \$2.20 and milk will cost \$0.55.

To help ensure that children with peanut allergy's are not in jeopardy of cross contamination only pre-made, pre packaged Uncrustables will be served in the kitchen. Our pizza on Fridays is made with a whole wheat crust, and our chicken nuggets and patties are all white meat. Our goal is to nourish our students. With this in mind, we will be rolling out our new Environments Menu adding more fresh fruits and vegetables.

Your child may choose one item from the main menu, i.e. hamburger, salad, Uncrustable or a premade deli sandwich or the hot alternate that will be featured each week. Children may choose a hot or cold vegetable, fresh or cupped fruit, and 1%white, fat free, strawberry or chocolate milk. A complete lunch comes with five components, meat/meat alternate, bread, vegetable, fruit and milk. Each child must select three of the five components in order for us to ring up a complete lunch and not ala carte items.

We will also be selling baked chips, low fat sherbet and fruit or veggie cups for snacks as time permits during the week. Children may purchase one snack a day. The snacks range in price from \$0.25 to \$1.00. Water is not a part of lunch and is offered as an ala carte item for \$1.00. The State of NJ set this rule stating that water has no nutritional value.

We hope this information will help you and your child have a happy, healthy lunch experience. To learn more about Chartwells, visit our website at www.eatlearnlive.com. Log onto www.payforit.net the screens will guide you through the process to establish your account. Deposits are made available the day the money is received by the staff.

Please complete the bottom portion of this letter and return with your deposit in an envelope marked "Lunch Program." Though it is preferred that students utilize the debit system, **cash will still be accepted at all registers**. Cashiers will verbally notify children when they have only five prepaid lunches remaining. You will also be contacted by phone or email. Students will be permitted to purchase up to two lunches on credit.


