Our 29th annual YSI holiday project was a success thanks to the support and generosity of our entire community! VES Peer Partners filled a box truck and







Celebrating the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and a Day of Service

Shortly after the 1968 assassination of the great civil-rights activist, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., individuals in both the Senate and the House of Representatives began proposing legislation to honor him with a federal holiday. However, it took almost 15 years before the first Martin Luther King Day would be celebrated in 1986. As we approach the anniversary of this commemoration, let us remember the words of Coretta Scott King (Washington Post, 1983):



"The holiday must be substantive as well as symbolic. It must be more than a day of celebration ... Let this holiday be a day of reflection, a day of teaching nonviolent philosophy and strategy, a day of getting involved in nonviolent action for social and economic progress."

Today, it has become traditional to celebrate the legacy of Dr. King through acts of service. We look forward to honoring Rev. Dr. King!

Reminders for Reporting Your Child's Absence

Please note, to report a student's <u>absence/tardy/early dismissal</u>, you may follow either of the two steps below. We ask that your report the absence **before 10:00 AM**. If an absence, tardy, or early dismissal is due to a medical reason and you have a doctor's note, please drop it at the front office or email it to <u>mnarula@mtsd.us</u>.

To report a student absence online using Genesis, please follow these steps:

- 1. Open a web browser on the Genesis logon screen at the address https://parents.mtsd.k12.nj.us
 - The Genesis logon screen may also be reached from any webpage on our district or school websites by clicking the global icon labeled "Genesis" at the top right of the page.
 - If accessing our mobile website through a device, from any webpage click the "Menu" button and select the option "Popular Links". From the popular links screen select "Genesis".
- 2. Log into Genesis and <u>follow the instructions behind this link to record a student</u> absence.
- 3. To report your child has tested positive for COVID-19, please log into Genesis and follow the instructions behind this link.

*The Genesis application also supports recording a student's absence and early dismissals.

To report a student absence via telephone, please follow these steps:

- 1. Call the Absence Hotline at 609-466-7610 and follow the prompts. Please include the following information in your voicemail:
 - Date of the absence
 - Student name (first and last)
 - Student grade & teacher
 - Reason for the absence
