## **Classroom Placement and Summer Prep**

As the end of the year approaches, plans for classroom placements are being made. Ms. Lacy and Mrs. Glover work closely with teachers, supervisors, and school counselors to place current 3rd and 4th graders.

Please note that 4th graders may happen to be placed in classes where they will have one teacher for language arts and another teacher for mathematics/science/social studies. Students will travel as a homeroom class between the two teachers. The two classroom teachers will work collaboratively as a team.

OHES administrators, Mr. Van Hise and Mrs. Caudill, place current 2nd graders into 3rd grade with our assistance. Ms. Lacy and Mrs. Glover will work closely with Mrs. Romano and Mr. Pachuta at the Lower Middle School to place all 4th graders into 5th grade.

All students will be placed in heterogeneous classes with the best possible teacher match, and a positive group of classmates. Any specific academic needs, as identified by classroom teachers, will be taken into consideration first. **We cannot honor requests for specific** 



**teachers, and requests for specific students can present a challenge.** However, we will consider input regarding special circumstances or information the school does not already have. Pertinent information shared in previous years must be resubmitted via email and received by **June 24th.** 

Please trust us to make the best placement possible for all children. It is important to us that students have successful academic and developmentally appropriate experiences in school with talented and caring teachers. Final placement information will be available in August.

#### General Third Grade Supply List 2025-2026

Dear Incoming Third Grade Students and Families,

In an effort to make your supply shopping easier, the third-grade team has come up with a list of supplies that you can begin to look for. We have chosen these items carefully and feel they enhance our instructional program.

- 1 set of coloring supplies (your choice...crayons, colored pencils, etc)
- 4 dry-erase markers
- 12 pencils (pre-sharpened, if possible)
- 1 pencil box (box or pouch)
- Whiteboard eraser/clean sock
- 1 pair of child-sized scissors
- 2 pocket folders (for Health and Spanish classes)
- Comfortable over-the-ear headphones (no wireless) with a <u>3.5mm</u> jack in a Ziplock bag with your name on it for your personal use

As you shop for a backpack, please DO NOT buy one with wheels. Your choice of a backpack must fit easily into your cubby in the classroom. Toward the end of the summer, be on the lookout for a letter from your classroom teacher requesting additional supplies and a warm welcome to VES.

Dear Rising 4th Grade Students and Families,



To help simplify your back-to-school shopping, the fourth-grade team has put together a suggested list of supplies to get you started. These items have been thoughtfully selected to support and enhance our instructional program.

- 1 set of coloring supplies (either colored pencils or markers, 8 count or more)
- 6 dry erase, LOW ODOR markers
- 1 whiteboard eraser
- 24 pencils (pre-sharpened, if possible)
- 1 hand-held pencil eraser
- 1 hand-held pencil sharpener
- 2 highlighters
- 1 black or blue sharpie marker
- 2 rolls of clear tape on a tape dispenser
- 1 large or 2 small glue sticks
- 1 pair of scissors
- 1 ruler
- 2 packages of 3" x 3" post its
- 1 pencil box (box or pouch)
- 4, 2-pocket folders (Includes Health and Spanish)
- 1 package of wet wipes
- 1 box of tissues
- Comfortable over-the-ear headphones (no wireless) with a 3.5mm jack (see image below) in a Ziplock bag with your name on it for your personal use

## Don't Lose Your Summer Vibe, or Your Student ID!

Please remember your student ID cards should be safely secured during the summer. Your child will need them again in September. Rising third graders will receive new IDs once they are processed and issued after school picture day. Rising 4th graders will use their current IDs again in 2025-2026. Their new cards will be processed and issued after school picture day when they become 5th graders at LMS.



## Sun, Fun, & a Quick Health Reminder from the VES Health Office

If your child currently has medication in the health office, plan to stop by anytime on or prior to June 24, 2025 to pick it up. Any medication that is not picked by the end of the school day on June 24, 2025 will be discarded. If you need to pick up your child's medication outside of normal school hours on June 24, 2025, you can arrange a time with the nurses to possibly do so. Please call the nurse to make these

arrangements. 609-466-7606 ext. 2500 or 2600.

New Jersey State law prohibits public schools from storing medications in the health office over the summer. This includes Epi- Pens, inhalers, insulin, eye drops, prescription and non- prescription medications such as Tylenol, Advil or Benadryl. Again, **all medications not picked up by a parent by 1:30 PM on June 24th, 2025** will be discarded in compliance with state regulations. Students are not allowed to carry any medication home in their backpacks per Montgomery Township School District Policy. Exceptions cannot be made to this policy.

The nurses would also like to remind parents that as students are enjoying the last days of school filled with activities, it is important that students wear sneakers or appropriate shoes for running and playing. Crocs and sandals are discouraged.
