- Call to Order and Welcome
- Principal Reports
  - email received that Principals will not be attending MSEPTA meetings
    - parents feedback is principals are not knowledgeable about special services
    - Principals attend Gen Ed PTA's and it appears that special ed students are not a priority
  - evening meetings may be hard for principals and they have a MSEPTA rep and way to communicate
  - option discussed to rotate principals or have a daytime meeting so they can attend and parents can ask questions
  - **Action:** Kristen to discuss option with principals
- BOE liaison report

- Special Services Director Update

- hybrid learning; increasing frequency of in-person learning; autism 5th and 6th program are 5 days per week; looking at preK-4th next for how to phase in 5 days per week; looking at survey results and what next group can be to increase to 5 days in-person
- Question: in HS, can a student do more in-person learning?
  - Kristen, looking at all groups and certain students based on individual needs can go in-person more; the school is discussing if students who choose hybrid learning, can they do more in-person learning?
  - Parents should reach out to case manager to request more in-person learning
- winter retreat was successful; looking for new series of these types of events; 3 presentations coming up and will send dates and time:
  - ESY, criteria, decisions, what is it?
  - post-secondary transition; college bound or DDD, DBR or employment
  - ESS; effective school solutions; mental health; co-host 2 presentations on sensory and behavior
- working with Jaime Velez for user group in Genesis; will have permission sign off in genesis to opt in to MSEPTA and SEPAG distribution list to increase awareness

  - will be part of new school year forms and required forms
    - recommendation to make it an opt out option

  - form will be sent to HS; need to decide on wording
    - make clear that the student does not have to be going to college; open to anyone who receives special ed services of any kind

  - Audrey recommended the grant provide examples of what the scholarship can be used for and have anonymous option
  - **Action:** Daryl and Jocelyn to discuss wording and help finalize Scholarship Form
