

As of Monday, April 20, 2020, College Board has released the following information about the AP Exams

- For the 2019-20 exam administration only, most students will take a 45-minute online exam at home. Most exams will have one or two free-response questions, and each question will be timed separately. Students will need to write and submit responses within the allotted time for each question. It is recommended that students type answers in a separate application and then copy and paste answer(s) into the response area. The paper option - handwriting answers - may be good for math and some science answers where drawing and special characters are required.
- Most students will be able to take these streamlined exams on any device they have access to, including a computer, tablet, or smartphone. AP World Language students will need to use a smartphone or tablet to record their answers, a computer or laptop will not be an option.
- The exam questions are designed in ways that prevent cheating. College Board will use a range of digital security tools and techniques, including plagiarism detection software, to protect the integrity of the exams.
- The AP Exams will be open-note or open-book exams. Students are allowed to consult class notes or books to compose their answers. They are not permitted to communicate with other students as they complete their exams.
- Students will be able to use their College Board approved accommodations for 2020 AP exams. More information on testing with accommodations can be found here: <https://apcoronavirusupdates.collegeboard.org/coordinators/accommodations>
- All AP students around the world will take AP Exams simultaneously.
- Colleges support this testing plan and are committed to ensuring that AP students receive the credit they've worked this year to earn.
- College Board has said that any student who wishes to cancel their exam may do so and will receive a full refund. To cancel an exam, students must request cancellation through their Total Registration accounts. After that, all that is necessary is that a student does not log-in to take their exam.
