Academic League

Attention seniors, sophomores and juniors; are you interested in testing your trivia knowledge? Come and join the Academic League! This league is hosted by the Somerset County Academic League. Every Thursday, ten high schools meet for a competition at one of the host schools. Competitions are similar to Jeopardy, where students are asked to answer questions in multiple subject areas. Students are asked to answer questions in twenty-five disciplines such as geography, math, science, mythology, English literature, songs, movies, sports, arts, and entertainment. Students are also expected to meet one week for practice starting early October.

STAGE BAND: The stage band performs standard big-band jazz repertoire. Students meet two times per week for two hours from December through June. In order to join, students must pass an audition on an instrument from the big band idiom (saxophone, trombone, trumpet, drum-set, mallet percussion, piano, bass, guitar). Audition materials will be available in November and can be found in the band room. Additionally, students must be a member of the curricular music program with the exception of guitar and piano. The stage band performs in regional jazz festivals, MHS' very own Big Band Bash, as well as other community events. Please speak with Mr. Brennan for any questions.

JAZZ BAND: The jazz band is an advanced-skills jazz ensemble that performs standard big-band jazz repertoire. Students meet three times per week for

two hours from December through June. In order to join, students must pass an audition on an instrument from the big band idiom (saxophone, trombone, trumpet, drum-set, mallet percussion, piano, bass, guitar). Audition materials will be available in November and can be found in the band room. Additionally, students must be a member of the curricular music program with the exception of guitar and piano. The jazz band performs in regional jazz festivals, MHS' very own Big Band Bash, as well as other community events. Please speak with Mr. Kahalehoe for any questions.

PIT ORCHESTRA: The pit orchestra provides live musical accompaniment for the school's spring musical. Instrumentation changes year to year depending upon the requirements of the musical production being performed. Once the instrumentation requirements are known, they will be advertised to the students. To join the pit orchestra, students should express their interest to Mr. Kahalehoe. Depending upon the needs of the show and student interest, Mr. Kahalehoe will determine if an audition is necessary. The students rehearse from January to March after school and during some Saturday rehearsals. Please speak with Mr. Kahalehoe for any questions.

MARCHING BAND AND COLOR GUARD: Marching Band (including color guard) begins with a two-week camp in late August. The marching band is open to all students at MHS! Any students who wish to play an instrument in the marching band must be a member of the curricular music program. Any students who wish to join the color guard simply need to sign up! Rehearsals are on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 2:50-5:00pm and on Fridays from 2:30-game end during the months of September to November. The Marching Band participates in competitions, festivals, and select community events. The Marching Band has been recognized as one of New Jersey's finest and consistently receives superior ratings at competitions and festivals. Students who have exemplary attendance at practices and games may be eligible to receive a Varsity letter. Please speak with either Mr. Kahalehoe or Mr. Brennan for any questions.

Additionally, the executive board runs a leadership training day and at least 1-2 fundraisers to help raise awareness or goods for a particular cause. Membership to student council demonstrates leadership and interest. Students who join have to participate in the Homecoming events and at least one other activity during the year. Student council generally meets every 1-2 months.
