## Welcome to Sixth Grade!

I am looking forward to an exciting year of learning and growing with all of you. I hope the information on this paper will answer some of the questions you may have. This is going to be an exciting year for all of us, full of growth, change, and FUN! Below is a list of supplies that I ask you to bring to class <u>every</u> day:

● A 70-100 page Mead Five-Star spiral notebook: 8 1/2 x 11 ", college-ruled, with a plastic cover (This is for your Interactive Notebook, which I will describe to you in class)

- 1 Roll of Scotch (Clear) tape on a dispenser-Will be kept in classroom
- 1 Glue Stick-Will be kept in classroom
- Pencils (bring many and keep extras in your locker-NOT Mechanical!)
